#### Note 1: Company Information

#### Taxation

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are recognised for future tax consequences of temporary differences between the carrying values of assets and liabilities and their respective tax base. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured using enacted tax rates applicable on the balance sheet date. All other investments are classified as long term investments. Long term investments are stated at cost, except where there is diminution in value (Other than temporary) in which case the carrying value is reduced to recognise the decline. Current investments are carried at lower of cost and fair value, computed separately in respect of each category of investment.
