Named U.S. museum to repatriate 15 stolen Indian artefacts

The Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, is returning 15 antiquities to the Government of India after having learned that these were "illegally removed" from India.

All the sculptures were sold at one point by Subhash Kapoor, a dealer currently lodged at Central Prison, Thiruvananthapuram. Mr. Kapoor was arrested in Germany in 2012 and handed over to the Tamil Nadu Police. Last November, he was convicted and handed a 10-year imprisonment for the offences of burglary and illegal export of 19 antique idols estimated at \$94 crore from a temple in Ariyalur to the Art of the Past Gallery, New York, a few years ago.

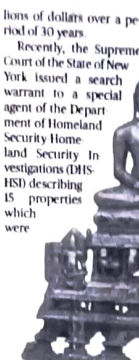
Museums and art galleries across the world have been handing over art works sold by him to Indian authorities. In 2019, Mr. Kapoor, who is an U.S. citizen, was charged by prosecutors in Manhattan, U.S. with stealing and possessing artefacts worth millions of dollars over a period of 30 years.

Recently, the Supreme Court of the State of New York issued a search warrant to a special agent of the Department of Homeland Security Home Land Security Investigations (DHS-HSI) describing 15 properties which were

cited as stolen and constituting evidence in criminal cases. The officials executed the warrant on Thursday. Sources said the antiquities would be returned to India.

Meanwhile, the Metropolitan Museum in a statement said it had contacted Homeland Security.

"about works from Kapoor in 2015 and is acting on this matter" as a result of the criminal investigation by the Manhattan District Attorney's office. The sculptures date back from the 1st century BCE to the 19th century CE, and include terra cotta, copper, and stone works. Among the antiquities is an enthralling sand stone sculpture of Apsara, the celestial dancer. The 33.5-inch tall sculpture from Madhya Pradesh dates back to the mid 1st century CE and is worth \$10,00,000 (around \$2 crore).

A 1st-century BCE ceramic pot from Chandraketu-

garh (archaeological site near Kolkata), a stone bust of Kamadeva, the God of Love, from the second half of the 8th century CE, and a Svetambara enthroned Jina, with attendant Yaksha and Yakshi, belonging to the 19th century CE, are also part of the antiquities.

"Today's forfeiture is proof that despite Mr. Kapoor's indictments in India and America, there are still hundreds, if not thousands, of antique objects sold by him with prestigious collections world wide," said S. Vijay Kumar, art enthusiast and Co-Founder, India Pride Project.

Kerala Lok Ayukta leaves CMDRF case to larger Bench

Difference of opinion between two judges leads to split verdict; complaint of nepotism had been filed against Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan and his Cabinet colleagues in the previous LDF govt.

A difference of opinion between two judges of the Kerala Lok Ayukta has resulted in a split verdict in a nepotism complaint against Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan and his Cabinet colleagues in the previous Left Democratic Front government. The Lok Ayukta, therefore, referred the matter to a larger Bench on Friday.

The Lok Ayukta weighed whether it had the jurisdiction to investi-

gate an "impugned" 2017-18 Cabinet decision to re-compense the next of kin of two late political allies and a deceased personal security officer of a departed ruling party leader from the Chief Minister's District Relief Fund (CMDRF) meant mandatorily for mitigating the deprivation of those in dire need.

The Bench headed by Lok Ayukta Cyril Joseph and Upa Lok Ayukta Harun-Ul-Rashid ruled that "as there is difference of opinion between us on the basic issue whether the action of respondents 2 to 18

violations raised by the complainant, we are constrained to place this complaint for investigation by the Lok Ayukta and both the Upa Lok Ayuktas together as required under Section 7(1) of the Kerala Lok Ayukta Act, 1999," the order said.

Hence, it constituted a full Bench comprising the Lok Ayukta and two Upa Lok Ayuktas to weigh the maintainability of the petition seeking a declaration disqualifying Mr. Vijayan and his former Cabinet colleagues from holding public office.

19-year-old raped in moving car; four held

A 19-year-old girl was allegedly gang-raped in a moving car in the intervening night of March 25 and 26 in a chilling reminder of the 2012 gang rape case of New Delhi that spurred protests and changes to laws dealing with sexual abuse.

Four youth, all in the 22 to 24 age group, were arrested within eight hours of the crime being reported. According to the police, the rape survivor was reportedly sitting with a male friend in a park near the National Games Village, Koramangala.

One of the accused approached them and wanted to know what the girl was doing in the park "late in the night with a male friend", leading to an argument.

When rebuffed, the ac-

cused allegedly came back with three of his friends, dragged the girl into a car and sped away, the police said.

The girl in her complaint alleged that four men took turns to rape her in the car. The police said that the car, now recovered, travelled the city's streets via Domlur, Hosur Road, and NICE Road.

"The accused were all from the same areas of Ejrupur and Rajendranagar and one of them was known to the victim's friend. We tracked all of them down in eight hours and arrested them," Mr. Raha said.

The arrested have been identified as Sarish, Vijay, Sridhar, and Kiran. While two of them work as office boys in nearby private firms, one is an electrician and another a BPO employee.

Bengaluru-Mysuru highway toll goes up

Barely a month after the toll collection started on the Bengaluru-Mysuru Expressway, the charges will increase from Saturday in accordance with the National Highways Authority of India's (NHAI) decision to increase toll charges on all the highways. Commuters who were uproot with the earlier decision to collect the toll itself, are now seeing red.

While the toll charges for a single-way journey on the expressway for cars is ₹135, it will be increased to ₹165 and for a return journey on the same day, the charges will jump from ₹205 to ₹250. Similarly, light commercial vehicles (LCV) and mini-buses will have to pay ₹770 instead of ₹720 for one-way trip and ₹1405 (earlier ₹1330) for a return journey while buses and trucks will have to pay ₹565 and ₹850 for a single-way and two-way journey, respectively.

Commuters argued that toll collection was not justified when the work on the expressway itself was not complete and said that the NHAI should have waited for the work to get over before increasing the toll.

Sahitya Akademi winner Sarah Thomas passes away

Writer Sarah Thomas, who passed away here on Friday at the age of 89, was someone who let only her writing do the talking. A quiet observer of life around her, she weaved in that she imbued into her seventeen novels and more than hundred short stories, some of

which were potent enough to stir the conscience of the oppressing classes.

As a girl growing up in a conservative household, an early passion for writing closed many doors for her, rather than opened them. She had to wait till the age of 34, to get her first work *Jeevitam Oru Nadhi* published. In later years, she would talk about how her wings

were clipped earlier on, in her childhood. Yet, within those limitations, she soared high with the sheer quality of her prose and the relevance of the subjects she chose to weave her stories around.

She is best known for her 1978 novel *Narmadipudava*, about the travails of Kanakaambal, who gets married and becomes a widow as a teenager,

and her struggles to overcome the stifling customs of the community. The book won her the Kerala Sahitya Akademi Award in 1979. *Deivamakkal*, another popular work of hers, focussed on the prejudice and discrimination that Dalits have continued to face. Her novel *Munipadukal* was adapted to the movie *Manimukham*, directed by P.A. Backer.

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
