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NATIONAL PAINT AND
VARNISH WORKS OPENED

MR. RAJU ON COLLECTIVE AGREEMENTS
BETWEEN WORKERS AND
INDUSTRIALISTS

SECUNDERABAD, Jan. 5.
"What is profit? It is a civilised
euphemism for looting. The indus-
trialists of Hyderabad must give up
the profit motive", said Mr. V.B.
Raju, Labour Minister, opening the
"National Paint and Varnish Works"
an industrial establishment, this
evening near Chikkadpalli.

Mr. Chandulal, ex-Chief Engineer,
who welcomed the Minister, said
that Mr. Raju was the youngest and
the most enthusiastic Minister of
the Hyderabad Cabinet. He said
that Mr. Raju had the knack of
making the labour obey him.

About 100 industrialists and mer-
cantile people attended the opening
ceremony.

When the Minister formally
switched on the machinery the
machine refused to move.

The refusal of the machine to
start, Mr. V. B. Raju said, was a
pointer to the fact that industria-
lists would be beset with initial im-
pediments, but they should not be
discouraged by them. It would not
pay in these days unless industria-
lists had patience.

The importance of the present in-
dustrial concern, the Minister said,
lay in the fact that while in the re-
cent years (and especially since the
popular Ministers took office), the
Government were exercising closure
of industrial concerns, they had now
a new industrial institution. The peo-
ple of Hyderabad would have real
psychological satisfaction only when
they achieved economic self-suffi-
ciency. He warned that if all the pro-
ductive resources were not pooled to-
gether "we would be soon facing
complete chaos."

Mr. Raju pleaded for canalisation
of forces. Every section of the
society must strive to meet the re-
quirements and promote the in-
terests of other sections. On account
of past experience, Governmental
activity came to be regarded as in-
terference, but the Government's
activity was only one of co-ordina-
tion.

Workers were a component part
of the whole structure of an indus-
trial establishment. The major part-
ner of course was the investor. But
besides labour and investors, there

be tolerated. The Minister revealed
that in the year 1949, Hyderabad im-
ported goods valuing 50 crores of
rupees while exports brought only
29 crores of rupees. Thus it lost 30
crores of rupees. It was upto
workers and industrialists of Hyder-
abad to make good the loss.

The Minister said that India is the
most stable state in Asia. But with
political stability they must achieve
economic stability also. They in
Hyderabad had peace, stable Gov-
ernment, raw materials and enough
man power. If they were not diffi-
dent, the people must be able to
achieve economic self-sufficiency.

Concluding the Minister pleaded
for proper planning of industries,
starting of small industries which
would immediately solve the pro-
blems of scarcity and unemployment.
He asked people not to "hide na-
tion's money". He promised Gov-
ernment's technical assistance. Gov-
ernment was determined to see that
none would be unemployed.—UPI.
