THE HONOURABLE SRI JUSTICE K.SARATH WRIT PETITION No. 46318 of 2022

ORDER:

This writ petition is filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for the following relief:

"....to issue an appropriate writ, order or direction more particularly one in nature of Writ of Mandamus, declaring the action of the respondents in not considering the representation of the Petitioner Association dated 14.10.2022, for regularization, according free hold rights to the original lessees of Petitioner Association by executing registered sale deeds in their favour in their respective plots and by duly exempting from payment of land and for allotment of TSIIC land at 15-20% rebate on land cost in case of relocation in TSIIC Parks, as illegal, arbitrary, violative of principles of natural justice, against the G.O.Ms.No.285 dated 24.10.2008, against the provisions of Azamabad Industrial (Termination and Regulation of Leases) Act 1 of 2000 and against all settled principles of law and consequently direct the 2nd respondent to consider

the representation of the Petitioner Association dated 14.10.2022".

- 2. Heard Learned Counsel appearing for the Petitioner-Association and Learned Government Pleader for Industries Commerce appearing for the respondent Nos.1 and 2 and Learned Government Pleader for Revenue appearing for the respondent Nos.3 and 4.
- 3. During the course of hearing, it is brought to the notice of this court that for redressal of the grievance of the Petitioner-Association, the Petitioner-Association herein submitted a representation dated 14.10.2022 to the respondents and no action has been taken on the said representation and a copy of the same is also enclosed as material paper along with the writ petition.
- Having regard the nature of controversy, the writ petition is disposed of, without expressing any opinion on the entitlement of the Petitioner-Association,

directing the respondents to take appropriate action on

the representation dated 14.10.2022 submitted by the

Petitioner-Association herein, in accordance with law,

within a period of eight (8) weeks from the date of

receipt of copy of this order.

5. Miscellaneous petitions pending consideration, if

any, in the Writ Petition shall stand closed in

consequence. No order as to costs.
