This is regarding seepage in E-Block sub Cellar floor. Sir, after close observation we have found that there is continuous seeping of water in to sub cellar along E-Block retaining wall at 2 locations of 30 feet length. Seepage is through minute pores along the flooring and retaining wall joint. This continuous seepage is the reason for water in sub cellar floor.

There is continuous water coming out from expansion joint at column joint.

Attached to the mail are the photos of seepage areas and expansion joint seepage.

Brick work and plastering of joint has no effect on seepage.
