What is Thalassemia?

It's a genetic disorder of the blood that impairs oxygen transport. Thalassemics need blood transfusion every 3 to 4 weeks. They can't survive without treatment. Your blood can help them lead an absolutely normal life.

Treatment:

There is no cure for Thalassemia¹. Management is simple. It requires regular blood transfusions, chelation drugs to reduce iron build-up and regular checkups.

Prevention:

4% of Indians are carriers of the Thalassemia (minor) trait, but are healthy. However, both parents with Thalassemia (minor) can have children with Thalassemia (major), which is a life threatening condition. Screening for Thalassemia is highly recommended before marriage or planned parenthood.

How can you help?

Donate your blood once a year². Thalassemics need only 1 of the 4 components of your blood. The balance will also help others in need.
